At <u>The Flower House</u> Mercedes and I laid out cardboard over the lawn spaces that are currently winterizing to prepare for Spring planting. We laid out hose in the shape she preferred, filled in with cardboard, and covered with the mulch she likes called "Soil Pep" from Mountain West. There are sources for you-haul non-cost and non-impact mulches for sites in which there is not a preference of materials, and I am pursuing one of those this week as well for sustainable options.

We also found a trellis at Second Hand Finds, and brought it to frame the back gate at The Flower House. It fits perfectly and is nearly the exact width of that back gate. I think it will be really pretty when covered with the wild Grape Vines that will grow along that back yard fence line.
