Bill and Dotty did not even know Phlox pilosa was in this prairie!



one below went right into my glove, and Bill sported a seed throughout the entire time on the front of his shirt!




The Marbleseed- *Onosmodium* bejariense- below right is in full bloom, this one is really gorgeous up close in a photo! Worth the snap and enlarge!
