> Woooooowwww!! The Rock Star of Prairie Ecology...Drum Roll...


<u>Chris Helzer</u> was keynote speaker and guide for the <u>Loess Hills Prairie Seminar!</u>


Below left, The LoHi Hikers took a much needed break and filled water bottles at


'The Wild Mess In Progress' and then continued on for another few hours of
