
# <u>Weekly Wíld Wednesday</u>


National Native Seed Conference, which we did NOT know about until this note! Native Plant Day-

Jamie Beyer will present the program, *Pollinator Friendly Plants and Habitat* Pollinators include butterflies, hummingbirds, native bees and honeybees. 
