- A native plant to the eastern United States and Texas
- Has small white to light pink flowers that bloom from July to September
- Has aromatic foliage that deters deer and rabbits
- Grows in dense clumps that suppress weeds
- Spreads through underground rhizomes
- Can be aggressive in moist conditions

Benefits A must-have for pollinator gardens, A tough and adaptable perennial, and Has no serious disease issues.

people helped stick on the newly packaged seeds! Marcie re-stocked the library-- so pop over to pick up your seeds!




It takes a village to stock a Seed Library! It is NOT too late to Winter Sow these seeds!


