

## Sioux plant sale gets ready

Being a volunteer operation, many aspects of the annual Sioux Master Gardener plant sale are still a mystery. The third annual sale will be like others, unfolding as volunteers and the community get involved.

These are the things we are certain of:

The sale will be held 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. May 10 at the Extension office, 400 Central Ave. NW, Orange City.

 At this point there will be well over 30 varieties of tomato plants, about 10 kinds of peppers, five excumber varieties and an assortment of other vegetables and flowers.
We will have a lot of snap dragons, some lysianthus, a few gazanias, some divided peremitals and more.

• We will be accepting more plant donations the week of the sale. Those can be lef at the Extension office. These can include seedlings or unused portions of purchase packs of plants. We also accept divided perennials.

 Master Gardeners will be on hand to greet visitors, talk about gardening, sell plants and answer questions.

 "And the best part," says John Buntsma, county Master Gardener coordinator, "is we will find a good home for all the unsold plants." Last year those went to flood victims, local agencies who deal with people in need and food pantries. "This fun event gets better every year," Buntsma said.
