Advice for other chapters

The Loess Hills team suggests other Wild Ones chapters considering a seed library to start small, noting that Rose's traveling library was a low-cost way to test the concept. Second, partner with a trusted community hub like a nature center or library to maximize reach and cred-ibility. Third, invest in education; workshops and detailed resources empower users to succeed. Finally engage trusted volunteers in seed collection to build community and ensure a sustainable supply.

"It's about creating a cycle of giving and growing," Rose said. "The more people participate, the stronger the impact."
